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| Installation of Solar Electrification System at Public Well for Water Supply to all Households in Village. | Morwad (Dist Beed) | Allied Activity | Villagers need 25 HP motor to lift water from the public well and supply drinking tap water through to every household. Due to the irregular electricity supply and loadshedding, people are unable to get drinking water and suffering from various water borne diseases. |
| Construction of Compound wall to ZP School (200 ft X 250 ft) | Morwad (Dist Beed) | Jeevandhara | Construct the school compound wall for security and safety of the students and teachers. |
| Supporting Playground /games to the ZP School | Morwad (Dist Beed) | Jeevandhara | This infrastructure support will help to increase the attendance of the students and will also help them for playing and sport activities. |
| Creating 6 water percolation tanks at mountain side | Morwad (Dist Beed) | Dharti | This activity will help to increase the ground water level. |
| Creating 5 Farm ponds for plants | Morwad (Dist Beed) | Dharti | Support to create 5 farm ponds for collecting and storing rainwater for various agricultural and livestock farming uses. It will mainly help to watering to the plants in 'SUD Park' |
